"Just as a rough slab of marble must be carefully guarried, cut and polished to make it beautiful and valuable, the Mandir will serve as a tool to carve and mold an individual's soul to be selfless and pure." Open to all, the newly inaugurated Mandir will help the over one-hundred thousand Indo-Americans in the Chicagoland area to "celebrate their past heritage, address their present problems and bless their future generations," said Pujya Vivekmurti Swami, the senior most sadhu (Saint) in the Midwest region of BAPS, with regards to the benefits of the Mandir in Bartlett. In addition, the unique and intricate architecture of the Mandir, built according to ancient custom, truly makes it a sight to behold.

The inspirer of the BAPS Shree Swaminarayan Mandir and spiritual leader of BAPS, His Divine Holiness Pramukh Swami Maharaj began the ceremonial opening with the release of 60 doves as a representation of the Mandir being a place of paramount peace. Illinois State Representative John J. Millner also echoed this feeling when he summarized the sight by stating, "This is the temple of peace!" Divine Holiness Pramukh Swami Maharaj has gone further by describing the Mandir as a place "which instills character, teaches us to respect one another, and where the mind becomes still and allows us to realize God." Many people from around the US, UK, Africa, Australia and India took part in the celebrations today. When asked how he thought the Mandir would impact the community, Consulate General of India Arun Kumar added that "The Mandir is great. When you go to the Mandir, you will not only find peace within your heart but also within the heart of others." He added that he was very impressed with the BAPS community and was very proud to have such a beautiful representation of India in our community. In addition to the opening of the Mandir, many were able to savor and experience the rich Indian culture and heritage yesterday morning through a Shobha Yatra (grand procession). This majestic parade on Columbus Drive featured nine ornately decorated floats, festive Indian dances and colorful costumes representative of a diverse India.

Today, as part of the Murti Prathista (installation of the sacred idols), His Divine Holiness Pramukh Swami Maharaj infused life into the sacred images that will reside in the Mandir for centuries to come. Through Pramukh Swami Maharaj's teachings, devotion and inspiration, thousands of volunteers have taken on such daunting tasks as the building of the Bartlett Mandir in addition to numerous humanitarian and social causes in order to spread the messages of purity and peace throughout the world. US Congressman Henry Hyde supported this idea when he addressed the assembly and said that he "hopes that the entire community at large will come to appreciate the value of peace embodied in the Mandir."
